Set Up

Receiving


Unboxing

Carefully unbox and remove all components. Unboxing guidelines:

- 1. Do not cut deep into a box with a blade as it could scratch the paint; only cut deep enough to cut the tape or use a dull edge.
- 2. Prior to assembling, organize all hardware and setup tools needed.



Fence Assembly

Fence Assembly:

1. Insert the ruler, with the desired measuring system (in. or mm) facing "up", into the front channel of the Rail.



2. Screw in the black Stop Stud into the threaded hole of the front channel on the right side. Tighten with an


Allen wrench.



<u>A WARNING!</u> DO NOT REMOVE THE STOP STUD. The ball bearings will fall out from the linear guide.


3. Install the black Knob into the threaded hole of the Handwheel. Tighten the nut against the Handwheel to

secure it.



A WARNING! DO NOT REMOVE THE FENCE HEAD. The ball bearings will fall out from the linear guide.

4. Loosen the two black plastic fence-lock knobs on the left side of the Adjustment Assembly, but do not remove them from the grey clamp. Slide the fence onto the gray clamp and tighten the two black knobs.





Bracket Assembly

Mounting Options:

There are several possible mounting positions for the brackets and fence, depending on the model of saw and desired fence location. Below are two of the most common examples of possible mounting scenarios. Mounting locations other than those shown below are possible, depending on your specific circumstances.

NOTE: Do not place fence mounting bracket over blade changing slot in table.





Bracket

Assembly:

The two mounting brackets can be attached as shown in either of the two previous pictures or in other configurations that best facilitate your specific saw and conditions.


NOTE: If the longer bracket fully spans the table of your saw, it can be attached without use of the shorter bracket.

NOTE: If your saw does not have mounting holes on the side of the table, holes can typically be drilled to align with the openings in the mounting brackets.

NOTE: Bracket mounting hardware is included for many band saws, but it may not be the correct hardware depending on your saw configuration and may need to be sourced locally.

1. Attach the brackets to the infeed side of the band saw table, finger tighten. Use two bolts through the Bracket(s). Do not fully tighten the mounting bolts, at this time.

NOTE: Make sure the mounting brackets do not cover the slot in the table for changing blades.



- 2. Make sure the brackets are aligned and flush with each other, parallel to the table top and approximately 2-1/8" below the top of the table. Tighten the bolts securing the brackets to the side of the saw table.
- 3. Attach the Fence Assembly Rail to the mounting brackets using four or five bolts (one bracket or two brackets) and washers, from underneath. Make sure the rail is parallel to the edge of the table top and tighten the four bolts.




4. Assemble the Reference Stop as shown below. Install the Reference Stop by sliding it into the second channel. It can be used on either the right or left side of the fence. Tighten in place when utilizing it as a reference for repeated cut dimensions.



Adjustments

Fence Adjustments:

The fence can be adjusted front-to-back by loosening the two Fence-Lock knobs on the left side of the fence and sliding the fence to the desired position.




Fence installed High position

The fence can be repositioned to the "lower" height by loosening the two Fence-Lock knobs, sliding the fence off and re-installing the fence at 90 degrees.



Fence installed Low position


The fence can be moved right-to-left using the Handwheel. Loosen the Travel Lock and rotate the Handwheel to position the fence. Lock the Travel Lock. One revolution of the Handwheel equals ¼" fence travel.




The fence can also be moved quickly from right-to-left, by disengaging the rack-and-pinion engagement, (by lifting the Lock Lever (straight-out), pulling out the Red Plate and sliding the fence).

IMPORTANT! Always engage the Lever Lock, with Red Plate seated, when using the fence.


To re-engage the Micro-Adjustment, make sure the integrated spring has pulled the Red Plate into position and press down on the Lock Lever.





Drift Adjustment:

The fence can be adjusted for blade-drift by adjusting the fence parallel to the drifting of the band saw blade. To adjust the fence, loosen the two Drift Locks on the left side of the fence assembly. Rotate the drift Adjustment Knob, clockwise or counterclockwise to adjust the fence parallel to the blade drift and lock the two Drift Locks.



HINT: A method to adjust the fence for blade drift; Use a sample piece of wood with a straight edge along one side. Draw a pencil mark along the length of the stock, parallel to the straight edge several inches from the left edge. Position the stock with the straight edge against the fence and align the stock with the pencil mark to the saw blade. Cut the stock. When completed note the cut edge of the stock compared to the pencil line. If the cut does not exactly follow the cut line, adjust the Drfitmaster fence and continue testing (by drawing a new parallel line on the stock and cutting and adjusting the fence) until the test cut parallels the pencil mark.

Ruler Adjustment:

After the desired bandsaw blade has been installed and properly tensioned and the fence has been adjusted for blade drift, move the fence close to the blade. Using a ruler, measure the distance between the blade and the fence.

Slide the Ruler to the same measurement as taken from the blade to fence. Tighten the two set screws, one on each side of the Ruler, to hold the Ruler in place. Be careful not to over tighten the set screws.

IMPORTANT NOTE! Do not attempt to remove the fence assembly from the rail assembly! Do not lift the fence assembly and do not slide the fence assembly from the rail. Damage to linear guide system will occur. The fence and rail must always remain as one unit and not separated.

Removal of the fence and rail assembly can be safely accomplished by removing the bolts securing the rail to the mounting bracket(s) and removing the entire fence and rail assembly. Or by removing the bolts securing the mounting brackets to the saw.

Operation

Align the fence with the desired distance between the saw blade and the edge of the fence. Make sure the Lever Lock is tight (down) and lock the fence in place. Make the cut following the cutting instructions and warnings associated with your band saw.


Maintenance

▲ WARNING! Never perform and setup, maintenance or adjustments with the machine connected to the power source! ▲ WARNING! If you have any doubt about the described procedure, seek professional assistance. Do not attempt any procedure that you feel is unsafe, or that you do not have the physical capability of achieving.

A WARNING! When removing banding, extreme caution must be used as the banding will spring when cut.

General

- 1. Keep your machine and fence clean. At the end of each day, clean the machine and fence. Wood contains moisture, and if sawdust or wood chips are not removed they will cause rust.
- 2. Apply a light grease to the adjusting screw for drift adjustment & fence tilt (#20) once per month.
- 3. Apply a light grease to the worm gear (#33 & 34), which contacts the rack, once per month.
- 4. Periodically check that all nuts and bolts are tight.
